BRIEF BIOGRAPHIES

Dr Russell Roberts FRCP MBBChir MA

Dr Roberts completed medical training in Cambridge and London before moving to the North East of England to undertake specialist training in Renal and General Medicine. Appointed Consultant Physician at Bradford Teaching Hospitals in 2001 and Honorary Senior Lecturer at the University of Leeds. Appointed as Associate International Director to the Royal College of Physicians in 2016 and is Chair of the Nephrology Specialist Certificate Exam Standard Setting Group. Recent publications focused on Quality Improvement in Acute Kidney Injury.

Dr Joseph Cheriyan FRCP MA MBChB

Dr Cheriyan is a Consultant Clinical Pharmacologist & Physician at Cambridge University Hospitals, UK and Associate Lecturer, University of Cambridge. He is an active clinical researcher in cardiovascular medicine particularly vascular function and inflammation working on early phase experimental medicine studies since 2006. His post combines NHS research within a University Department, in close collaboration with GSK's only remaining in-house Clinical Unit, where he is seconded as a Senior Clinical Pharmacologist. He founded Cambridge Medical Seminars in 2006 and leads the Experimental Medicine Training modules at the University of Cambridge. He is Vice Chair of the Cambridge Central Ethics committee, directs the Cardiovascular Office of the Cambridge Clinical Trials Unit where he also sits on the Management Board.

Professor Edmund Ong FRCP FRCPI MSc DTMH MBBS

Prof Edmund Ong is actively involved in infection-related clinical research and teaching and takes on leadership roles as a principal investigator in trials and former training programme director in Infection, Microbiology, Virology and acute general medicine. He is an advisor to a number of UK national and international health care organisations including Public Health England, MSF (Medecins Sans Frontieres), Medical Action Myanmar in areas of HIV, Tuberculosis and Malaria. He is a former chairperson and presently a member of the BHIVA Audit and Standards Subcommittee. He co-chaired the National UK HIV Testing Guidelines in 2008. He is a PACES examiner for MRCP examination of the Royal College of Physicians (UK) and Diploma in HIV Medicine of the Society of Apothecaries, London, UK. Dr Ong has contributed to numerous text books of infection and has co-authored more than 130 papers in peer reviewed journals. He is presently co-supervising a number of collaborative PhD research projects internationally including Nigeria, Gabon, and Myanmar.

Dr Jane Sterling FRCP MBBChir

Dr Jane Sterling is a consultant in Dermatology at Addenbrooke's Hospital, Cambridge University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, UK. Her particular areas of interest within Dermatology are infections of the skin and vulval disease.

She qualified and also trained in Dermatology in Cambridge. She held a Medical Research Council Training Fellowship leading to PhD in pathology of Human Papillomavirus in 1990 followed by MRC Clinician Scientist Fellowship. Since then, she has remained active in research with laboratory work in the Pathology Department and has supported or collaborated with dermatologists, gynaecologists, ENT surgeons and GU Physicians in research projects. This research into the role of viruses in skin and genital diseases overlaps with an interest in disorders affecting the vulva and she has led multi-disciplinary vulval clinics for over 25 years.

Dr Sterling has held several roles in training and education in Dermatology, both locally in the University of Cambridge School of Clinical Medicine and nationally as part of the team developing and maintaining standards for the Dermatology Specialty Certificate Examination. She has served as Chair of the RCP Joint Specialty Committee in Dermatology, as Academic Vice President of the British

Association of Dermatologists, as President of the Dowling Dermatological Society and is now President Elect of the Dermatology Section of the Royal Society of Medicine.

Dr Fraz Mir FRCP MA MBBS

Dr Fraz Mir is a Consultant Physician in Acute Medicine and Clinical Pharmacology & Therapeutics at Cambridge University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, UK. He is also an Associate Lecturer in the Department of Medicine, University of Cambridge. His clinical and research interests are in the fields of cardiovascular medicine, hypertension and toxicology. He is actively involved in teaching at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels and, most recently, his passion for education and teaching culminated in his appointment as Head of School of Postgraduate Medicine and Associate Postgraduate Dean, Health Education East of England. In this role, he is responsible for overseeing the clinical training and welfare of over 800 doctors across the region. In May 2018 he became a bye-fellow of King's College, Cambridge and from June 2013-2017, he was Associate International Director for the Royal College of Physicians (RCP) London.

Professor Tan Maw Pin MRCP MD MBBS BMedSci

Prof Tan Maw Pin is currently a Professor in Geriatric Medicine at the University of Malaya. She received her undergraduate medical training at the University of Nottingham. After passing her MRCP, she obtained a National Training Number in Geriatric Medicine at Newcastle upon Tyne, UK. During her geriatric subspecialty training, she undertook two years of full time research into falls in older people. She is now a highly research-active academic and is the Principal Investigator of the Promoting Independence in our Seniors with Arthritis (PISA) Grand Challenge and the Malaysian Falls Assessment and Intervention Trial (MyFAIT). She is also a co-investigator of the Malaysian Elders Longitudinal Research study. Her administrative roles include Research Coordinator at the Department of Medicine and Leader of the Ageing and Regenerative Medicine Research Thrust at the Faculty of Medicine. She is currently an academic editor for Plos One, and an associate editor for Frontiers in Medicine. She continues to practice geriatrics at the University of Malaya Medical Centre, and has set up the Falls and Syncope Service at the University of Malaya, as well as Chairing the hospital inpatient falls committee.

Dr Usha Rani MRCP MSc MBBS FCCP AM

Dr Usha Rani graduated from University of Mangalore in 1988 with an MBBS degree. She started her housemanship in Hospital Kuala Lumpur and later worked as a Medical Officer at Hospital Seremban. She started as a Registrar in Medical Unit, Hospital Tengku Ampuan Rahimah, Klang in 1990. After passing her MRCP examination in 1993, Dr Usha worked as a Clinical Specialist in Hospital Klang and at Institut Perubatan Respiratori, Hospital Kuala Lumpur until 1997. In the following year, Dr Usha obtained her Masters in Respiratory Medicine at Imperial College London with Distinction. Prior to joining Sunway Medical Centre as a General and Respiratory Physician in 2000, Dr Usha worked as a Consultant Physician and Chest Physician in Hospital Melaka.

Dr Wong Chieh Lee MRCP FRCPath PhD BSc(Hons) MBChB

Dr Wong Chieh Lee is a Senior Consultant Haematologist and the Clinical Director of the Clinical Research Centre at Sunway Medical Centre. She obtained her PhD degree in Medicine from Imperial College London, United Kingdom and is currently a member of the Cambridge Sunway Collaboration Steering Committee. Dr Wong was a Consultant Haematologist at Hammersmith & Charing Cross hospitals in London before returning back to Malaysia in 2009 to join the National University of Malaysia as an Associate Professor in Haematology & Internal Medicine. She obtained her Bachelor of Science degree (BSc) in Pathological Sciences and Medical degree (MB ChB) from Leeds University, United Kingdom. She received her postgraduate training in Internal Medicine and subsequently Haematology in London and was awarded the Certificate of Completion of Specialist Training (CCT). She is a Member of the Royal College of Physicians (MRCP) and a Fellow of the Royal College of Pathology (FRCPath).

Dr Wong's areas of expertise include myeloproliferative neoplasm, myelodysplasia, leukaemia, lymphoma, multiple myeloma and general non-malignant haematology. Her main research interest is in the molecular pathogenesis of myeloproliferative neoplasm involving the genetic and epigenetic signatures of the various subtypes of myeloproliferative neoplasm using microarray and next generation sequencing techniques.
